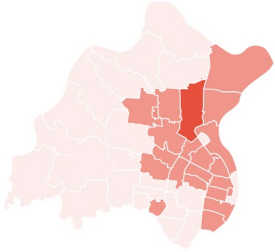

This FLOURISH grant funded the “Be the Change” project at Jennings 4th Ward Strong. This provided resources, support and healing to Black parenting families throughout the Jennings community. This project took place from November 2020 to March 2021.
