66 Child care is difficult to secure and almost always full. Having a changing work schedule and needing to use public transportation makes child care difficult to access.



Only 4 out of every 50 children get the care they need at the hours their parents need.



Meet **Brittaney**

Brittaney is a Black, single mother who works overnight shifts as a nurse and makes \$48,000 a year. She has two preschool-aged children.

It took months to find a solution because in St. Louis, there are only enough spots for 69% of families and only 12% of child care centers offer non-traditional care.

She was lucky to find a child care center that could take her children overnight while she worked. Child care will cost her \$15,000 each year.
